- Must be cost effective

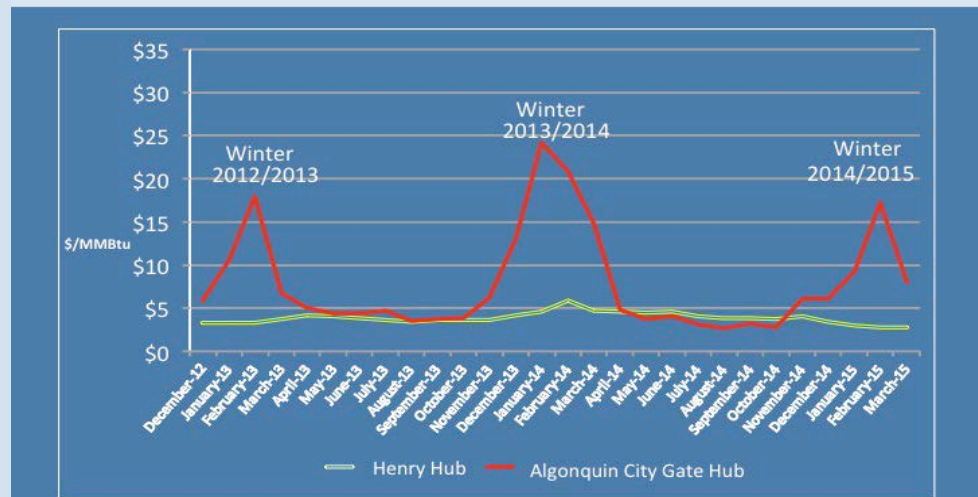
Cleaner:
