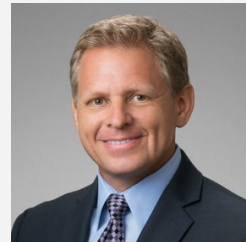

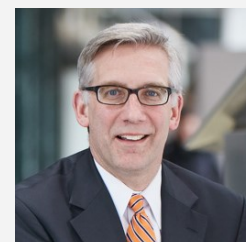


Elisabeth Treseder

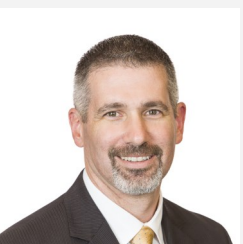

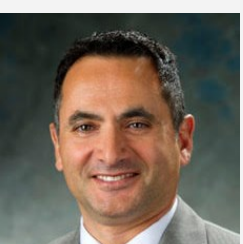

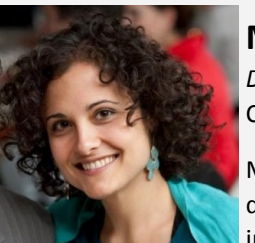
